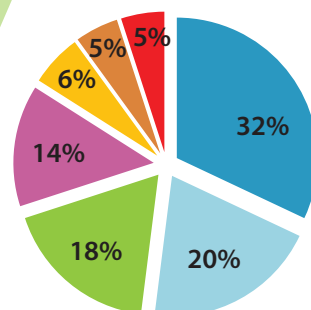

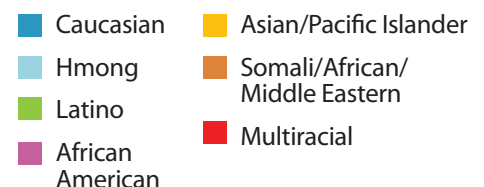
Increasing Culturally Specific Supports and Services

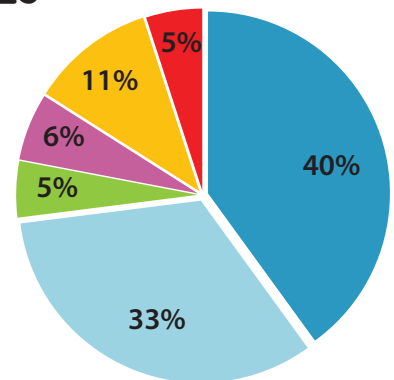
Achieving Collective Results

An independent evaluation of SRFC's safe school initiatives* showed statistically significant drops in fighting and physical or verbal harassment from 2007 - 2010 as reported by district consortia elementary, middle and high school students.

*A collaborative grant, from the Safe School/Healthy Students Initiative of the Departments of Education, Human Services and Juvenile Justice, supported a four year focus on school safety and violence prevention.
